Highlights of the Scheme

Eligibility to be an Intern

- Primarily open to full-time local undergraduate students from the 13 participating Hong Kong Institutions.
- Postgraduate and non-local undergraduate full-time students may also be considered at the discretion of the Institutions and Host Organisations, subject to any applicable visa/ entry requirements of the internship country concerned (e.g. Singapore has an upper age limit of 25 for Work Holiday Pass holders).
- Exchange students whose home institutions are not among the participating Hong Kong Institutions are not eligible for the Scheme.

Internship Period

- A minimum of 6-week physical internship outside Hong Kong during summer break of students (generally between May and August).
- Host Organisations may indicate the preferred period, while the actual internship period is subject to agreement with student interns.
- Remote or virtual internship entirely in Hong Kong is not accepted.

Honorarium for Student Interns

- Air tickets, accommodation, visa, insurance etc. are to be arranged by student interns with the assistance from respective Hong Kong Institutions, as well as the facilitation from respective Host Organisations.
- In previous years, the Scheme offered over 100 internship vacancies annually across
 a wide range of disciplines in various ASEAN countries, catering to the professional
 aspirations and academic interests of students. Vacancy information collected from
 Host Organisations, including job scope and specific requirements, is disseminated
 to students through respective Hong Kong Institutions.
- The more the better, subject to the capacity and need of individual Host Organisation.

For Students

Roles of Student Interns



Cooperate closely with Institution and Host Organisation(s) on the application and selection process, and the logistical and administrative matters if an internship offer is received and accepted.



Diligently complete the assigned internship duties in a professional and responsible manner.



Act as an ambassador for Hong Kong, promoting a positive image of the city and sharing its good stories with others.



Submit student evaluation form and photos via Institution after internship. Give prior consent for Institution and HKETOs to use the materials for publicity purposes.



For Institutions

Roles of Hong Kong Institutions



Provide support and guidance to student interns on logistical preparation (e.g. air tickets, accommodation, visa application, etc.) and throughout the internship.

Publicise internship opportunities to students, collect and screen applications, nominate candidates with CVs to Host Organisations. Be the contact point between students and Host Organisations before offers are made.

Ensure students are appropriately and sufficiently insured before embarking on the overseas internship.

Provide information to student interns on available financial support (e.g. scholarships and subsidy schemes) to facilitate their participation in the Scheme.

Inform HKETO in Singapore of successful placements and provide relevant information and statistics, for the purposes of emergency contact, record-keeping and data analysis.


Provide necessary mentorship and supervision to student intern(s) for immersion of industry environment.




