## Welcome Message

The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region is committed to nurturing young people and better preparing them to meet the challenges of an ever-changing global environment. In 2014, the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office (HKETO) in Singapore launched the ASEAN Internship Scheme for Hong Kong Higher Education Students with the aim of widening students' international perspectives and enhancing bilateral relations between Hong Kong and member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN). With the subsequent establishment of HKETOs in Jakarta and Bangkok in 2017 and 2019 respectively, the three offices now jointly administer the scheme by identifying internship opportunities in the ASEAN countries under their respective purview.

Since its launch, the scheme has met with very positive response, drawing the participation of over 860 students from 11 Hong Kong higher education institutions. Our past host organisations include government/statutory bodies, international organisations, universities, cultural organisations and private companies in different industries.

We hope that the young generation will seize this valuable opportunity to gain a better understanding of the fast-growing ASEAN region with which Hong Kong is developing increasingly close ties on all fronts.

We look forward to the continued support from both the Hong Kong higher education institutions and the host organisations to make the scheme a success.



## Vision & mission

The internship scheme aims to:

- give students first-hand practical experience in a field related to their career interest, with exposure to the socio-economic environment of the ASEAN region;
- cultivate students as the "ambassadors" of Hong Kong in the ASEAN region, and vice versa upon their return to Hong Kong, to enhance mutual understanding and strengthen the ties between Hong Kong and the ASEAN member countries;
- foster exchanges at university and industry levels between Hong Kong and ASEAN member countries to unleash potential for future cross-sectoral collaborations.
- groom a generation of culturally savvy leaders of tomorrow to benefit both Hong Kong and ASEAN member countries.



#### Overview

#### **Target**

Primarily full-time local undergraduate students at 11 higher education institutions in Hong Kong. Postgraduate and non-local undergraduate students can be included, if the institution/host organisation concerned consider it appropriate, subject to any applicable visa/entry requirements of the ASEAN country (eg. Singapore has an age limit of 25 for Work Holiday Pass holders.)

#### Internship Period

During the summer vacation of students, generally lasting from end of May to August. Host Organisations may state their preferred period in the provided Job Description form. Exact reporting period to be discussed between Host Organisation and student intern.

#### **Duration**

A minimum of 6-10 week physical internship in the respective ASEAN country is preferred. Virtual/remote internship in which the student intern stays entirely in Hong Kong will not be accepted.

### **Logistical arrangements**

Work visa, air tickets, accommodation, insurance etc are to be arranged by the Hong Kong Institutions and/or the student interns concerned. HKETOs' roles are limited to ascertaining Host Organisations' internship requirements, referring them to HK institutions and keeping a record of successful intern placements. Hong Kong Institutions shall ensure that students are appropriately and sufficiently insured for the entire internship period.

#### Job scope and screening

Host organisations can set out the job scope and specific requirements (eg. preferred academic faculty) in the provided Job Description Form. HK Institutions will nominate students for selection. Host organisations can conduct telephone or online interviews with the candidates before making offers.

## Number of vacancies at each host organisation


The more the better, subject to provision of proper coaching and sufficient immersion in the industry environment provided by Host Organisation for the student interns.



## Host Organisations should provide -

- Internship opportunities in a standard Job Description Form, followed by selection process upon receipt of information on nominated students from Hong Kong institutions, and announcement of successful candidates via HK institutions according to the implementation timeline
- Necessary support (e.g. providing a letter of offer) for student's visa application
- A safe work environment
- Necessary support to the student intern in case of an emergency

• Proper coaching and sufficient immersion in industry environment by assigning an officer/manager to be the student's mentor

At the Bali Film Festival, I had the valuable opportunity to meet Hong Kong filmmakers and be involved in cultural exchange in the film industry.




During the weekends, I visited the temples and parks in Yogyakarta in Indonesia. The mountain views are spectacular. I also learned tricks in the traditional puppet show.
