Under Secretary for Labour and Welfare, Mr Ho Kai-ming, delivered a career talk at the campus of National University of Singapore.





NUS student was keen to explore career opportunities in HK.

As part of HK Government's efforts to attract foreign talent, the Under Secretary for Labour and Welfare, Mr Ho Kai-ming, delivered a career talk at the campus of National University of Singapore (NUS) in August. Addressing about 100 students at scene, including undergraduate and MBA students from the Business School, Mr Ho shared HK's latest market trends and gave a walkthrough of different talent admission schemes. Professor Ming Wai-kit of the City University of Hong Kong also shared his personal experience to work and live in Hong Kong, and the support given by the government and non-government organisations including Hong Kong Quality And Talent Migrants Association to new migrants. Mr Ho highlighted that recent talent attraction effort was bearing fruit - as of end-July, around 120 000 applications had been received under various talent admission schemes, with over 75 000 approved and over 38 000 people arriving in HK. Of which, 30 000 applications had been approved under the newly-launched Top Talent Pass Scheme (TTPS), including about 270 friends from NUS and Nanyang Technological University, two of the world's top 100 universities. One merit of TTPS is the exemption of the need to first secure a job offer before coming to HK. It consists of three categories:
